ClimateSmart loan program workshops start Monday

Boulder County soon will start its next round of ClimateSmart loans, which help homeowners pay for energy-efficient and renewable-energy upgrades to their homes.

To participate, homeowners must attend one of a series of workshops that start Monday and run through April. The on-line loan application period is expected to open mid-April and run through May.

Eligible projects include increasing insulation in a home, replacing inefficient heating and cooling systems, installing biomass heating, sealing air leaks and installing photovoltaic, solar thermal or wind energy systems. The loans are repaid through a special assessment on a homeowner's property taxes, and the debt runs with the property.

There are workshops at the Center for ReSource Conservation, 2639 Spruce St., Boulder, from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday and Tuesday and again on March 22 and March 24. There are two workshops in Longmont at the end of the month. Additional workshops will be offered in April.
